

A Call For A Special Church Meeting

This is to notify the congregation that the Board of Trustees has scheduled a Special Meeting of the First Religious Society for **Sunday, October 4**, after coffee hour. The purpose of meeting is to approve a change to the by-laws. Rationale and wording below:

From minutes of August 24, 2014 First Religious Society Meeting:

Jean Cadwallader made a motion to take the necessary funds for the boilers and the pavement work out of the checking account. Elaine Olson seconded the motion.

Miles Dudgeon proposed amending the motion to take money from the checking account that is needed this week for the boilers and pavement from the money earmarked for the Steeple and Steps Campaign Fund. Then have a meeting in two weeks regarding using Endowment Funds for these expenses. Kevin Cappy seconded the amendment to the motion. There was discussion about the necessary repairs. Vote to modify the amendment passed. There was further discussion about possible amending the motion to pay the full bill that will be due, but no additional changes were made. The amended motion passed.

The Trustees of the First Religious Society now ask the First Religious Society to vote on a one time change to ARTICLE V, paragraph 4, of our Society's by-laws. This will only allow the Trustees to take up to \$30,000 from the Permanent (Endowment) Fund to only cover the replacement of the center steps and railings in front of the sanctuary. The total received from the Steeple and Steps Campaign to date is \$30,135, including interest. The project will take place in the Fall of 2015 or warm months of 2016, depending on scheduling with contractor Tom Kile.

The actual wording of this motion is in bold and italics: Article V, paragraph 4, "Members of the Committee are members of the Society elected by the Society. They shall have the care and custody of the Permanent Fund of the Society, making careful investments from the Fund and disbursing from the Fund toward the budget for the following year 5% of the average value of the Fund over the preceding twenty quarters as of September 30 of the current year. Funds will be transferred to the Treasurer of the Society on instructions from the Board of Trustees. *In addition to this disbursement a onetime withdrawal of up to \$30,000 shall be allowed to cover the replacement of the center steps and railings in front of the sanctuary.*"
