One: Strangers, foreigners, outsiders – names we give those whose ways unsettle us, or those we fear for changes they may bring.

All: O God, help us remember that your people were strangers, foreigners, outsiders in Egypt, Canaan, and Babylonia.

One: Strangers, foreigners, outsiders – too often we ignore their wisdom or discount their understandings.

All: O God, help us remember that the magi were outsiders who came to honor Jesus because of their insights.

One: Strangers, foreigners, outsiders – we define them as "other" so we can keep our distance, so we can withhold our empathy.

All: O God, help us remember there are no strangers, foreigners, or outsiders, for you have made us all, and in you we are all one.

One: Forgive us when we draw our circles in tightly and forget that you are the maker of diversity here on earth, and in the vast cosmos of galaxies and stars.

THE PRESENTATION

Congregational Response – presenting of the candle

EPIPHANY - The word epiphany means "manifestation" or "sudden appearing." During the Season after the Epiphany, which lasts from January 6 until the beginning of Lent, the church focuses on making Christ known to the world, reading stories of call, prophecy, and discipleship.

He has served the New York Conference of the United Church of Christ in many capacities, most recently as chair of the Conference Minister Search Committee and as chair of the Oneida Association Committee on Authorization of Ministry.

Matthew 2:1-12 - The Visit of the Wise Men

2 In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, ² asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage." ³ When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; ⁴ and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. ⁵ They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet:

⁶ 'And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler

who is to shepherd my people Israel.""

Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage." When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.
