CELEBRATION OF THE WORSHIP OF GOD

In Jesus' day, the Jewish feast of the Passover was the annual celebration of the greatest event in Jewish sacred history -- the exodus from bondage in Egypt. The night of the Passover was that fateful night in Egypt when the death angel passed over the Israelites, exempting them from God's divine wrath. On that night, God delivered them from the power of Pharaoh and freed them from slavery. The Passover meal or Seder is significant for Christians both as a way of experiencing the crucial connection between Christianity and Judaism and as a model of celebration centered in the home. Jesus shared a Passover meal (his "last supper") with his disciples the night before he was crucified.

While the Passover meal is traditionally celebrated in the home among family or with close friends, in recent years there has been a move toward celebrating the Passover in larger groups. The order of the service takes place around the dinner table before and after the meal. All participants take turns reading parts of the Seder from the "Haggadah" ("telling"), either individually or as a group. The Exodus story is told, questions are asked, symbols from the Seder plate are explained and songs are sung. Children and youth have a special role to play. They ask the four questions, hide the **Afikomen**, and open the door for Elijah. All of these roles have symbolic significance.

The CANDLES are lit by a woman at each table.

- One: Baruch Attah Adonai Elohenu...
- All: Blessed are you, O Lord our God, ruler of the universe, for you kept us alive and sustained us and brought us to this season. May this place be made holy by the light of your presence, shining upon us in blessing and giving us peace.

The WASHING OF HANDS is performed by dipping fingers into a cup of water.

- One: Baruch Attah Adonai Elohenu...
- All: Blessed are you, O Lord our God, ruler of the universe, for you have blessed us with your commandments that we might serve you with pure and holy hands.

The SYMBOLIC FOODS are presented.

The UNLEAVENED BREAD is introduced and prayed over.

One: Baruch Attah Adonai Elohenu...

All: Blessed are you, O Lord our God, ruler of the universe, for you redeem us as you redeemed our ancestors in Egypt, and you have permitted us to live to this night, to partake of unleavened bread and bitter herbs.

The SHANK BONE of the PASSOVER LAMB is introduced and prayed over.

One: Baruch Attah Adonai Elohenu...

All: Blessed are you, O Lord our God, ruler of the universe, for you hallowed us with your commandments and protected us by the blood of the lamb. The CHAROSETH and EGG are introduced and prayed over.

One: Baruch Attah Adonai Elohenu...

All: Blessed are you, O Lord our God, ruler of the universe, for you strengthened us with your commandments and delivered us from the house of bondage.

The HORSERADISH is introduced and prayed over.

- One: Baruch Attah Adonai Elohenu...
- All: Blessed are you, O Lord our God, ruler of the universe, for you strengthened us with your commandments and delivered us from the bitterness of our tears.

The MEALTIME GRACE & DOXOLOGY OLD 100th

Be present at our table Lord, be here and everywhere adored, these mercies bless and grant that we may feast in fellowship with thee.

Praise God from whom all blessings flow; In heaven above and earth below; One God, three persons, we adore. To God be praise forevermore. Amen.

The MEAL is eaten.

The FIRST CUP OF WINE/JUICE is poured . . . held high for the prayer . . . and then drunk.

- One: Baruch Attah Adonai Elohenu...
- All: Blessed are you, O Lord our God, for you have created the fruit of the vine.

The GREENS, parsley dipped in salt water, are prayed over and eaten.

One: Baruch Attah Adonai Elohenu...

All: Blessed are you, O Lord our God, for you have created the fruit of the earth.

The UNLEAVENED BREAD is broken. . . a portion is hidden for later.

CHORAL MUSIC (# 663, vs. 1, 2, 5) Go Down Moses

The SECOND CUP OF WINE/JUICE is filled . . .

The QUESTIONS are asked by the children.

EXODUS 12:21-27 is read.

The MIRACLE AT THE RED SEA is introduced. DRINK THE SECOND CUP OF WINE/JUICE, after saying this prayer.

One: Baruch Attah Adonai Elohenu...

All: Blessed are you, O Lord our God, ruler of the universe, for you have created the fruit of the vine.

A SONG OF THANKS, "Dayenu" is sung. (see musical pages)

The THIRD CUP OF WINE/JUICE is filled.

The INTRODUCTION and EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

One: Baruch Attah Adonai Elohenu...

All: Blessed are you, O Lord our God. You have liberated us from the power of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of your dear Son, the very image and reflection of your glory. In him we have received the forgiveness of sins.

The WORDS OF INSTITUTION are offered.

The LORD'S PRAYER is offered.

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil: for thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen.

SHARING THE BREAD & CUP AROUND TABLES

The CLOSING PRAYER (*Let us pray together* . . .) O God, by coming to your table we receive more gifts than we deserve. We give thanks for Jesus Christ, through whom we receive life and in whom we are bound in covenant. Renew us so we may willingly serve as Christ served. Amen.

The BENEDICTION is said.

The FOURTH CUP OF WINE/JUICE is filled.

- One: The door is opened for Elijah and the FOURTH CUP is filled. Baruch Attah Adonai Elohenu...
- All: Blessed are you, O Lord our God, ruler of the universe, for you have chosen us in Christ to be your people Israel.

Drink the FOURTH CUP.

One: We drink the Fourth cup as we proclaim, "Next year in Jerusalem!"


