The Personnel Committee, with concurrence with the Board of Trustees, is pleased to announce the hiring of our new Director of Christian Education, **Rachel Ditch**, to begin June 1. Rachel is no stranger to the Homer Congregational Church as she has been a member of our congregation since 2011 and for the last three years has been our "Member in Discernment" while attending Boston University School of Theology. Rachel just graduated with her Masters of Divinity and will be completing the necessary requirements from the Susquehanna Association of UCC NY Conference to be eligible for ordination.
