P.R.E.P. Event

(Providing Resources and Essentials to help Prepare School-aged children for School)

Many families in our community struggle at the start of a new school year to provide their children with the supplies and essentials needed to start school on the right foot. The average cost of a school supply list is \$25-\$60 per child.

This can be an extra burden for families that may already be struggling to make ends meet. Many schools and organizations already collect school supplies such as pencils, crayons, notebooks and backpacks to hand out to those in need. However, there are many other essential needs of children, such as shoes that fit, socks, toothpaste, toothbrushes, soap, tissues, and healthy snacks, to name a few. These all play an important role in keeping school children healthy and ready to learn. Meeting these care needs increases their chances for better academic performance and improved school attendance. These are critical factors that contribute to our children's chance for a successful future.



To show our concern and support of the children and families living in our area, Homer Congregational Church is organizing a **P.R.E.P.** event, August 27, on the Village Green. This will be a free offering for all families in our community. This event will offer not only **free ice cream, fun, and games**, but will also provide **free haircuts, sneakers, socks, underwear, and other essentials** to help families prepare their children for a successful school year. We are working with CAPCO, Bridges for Kids, the YMCA, and Catholic Charities to set up tables at this event in order to provide information about services that may be a valuable resource for families.

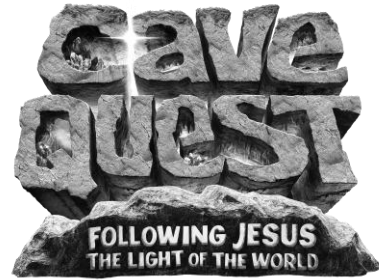
