Senior Fellowship Club Meeting, Tuesday, November 8, 2016

The Russell Fellowship Room was aglow with the lovely colors of fall... flowers, gourds, cornucopias, and bright leaves as the Senior Fellowship Club gathered for its pre-Thanksgiving meeting. A million thanks to Pat Signor, Nita Baldwin and Gwen Hayne for their skills in decorating and providing a festive atmosphere for us. I think a lot of us voted early on this Election Day as we had a fair-sized group present.



We opened our meeting with a special prayer in honor of all our veterans, those retired and those still on active duty. We also heard a story about a 90-year old retired soldier, a Congressional Medal of Honor winner who defied his local Homeowners Association and refused to take down the 25-foot flag pole on his property in Virginia along with the large American Flag he flew on it. The Homeowners Association said he could fly a flag but only on a bracket. The elderly soldier insisted that in the time he had left he was going to fly his large American Flag. He was denied a permit and faced court action.

This story then made National TV news telling of the soldier's extraordinary heroic actions in 1944 when he walked through a mine field and singlehandedly took out three enemy machine gun positions and returned with 17 prisoners of war. And later on he returned and took out three German tanks. The Homeowners Association rethought its position and agreed to indulge this aging hero who dwelt among them. A wise decision for the HOA as this soldier's medal of honor citation made it clear that he wasn't particularly good at backing down.

We also played some "Presidential Trivia" which seemed appropriate for Election Day, and then we enjoyed our refreshments, thanks to Nita B. and Sylvia H. for their delicious culinary creations.

Our special guest was Gail Bundy who presented an interesting program on Historic Markers in Cortland and Onondaga Counties. Gail discussed the history and background of historic markers, saying they are an important part of our landscape as they educate and inform us. She mentioned the marker here on our own village green and the one on Hooker Avenue as well as others throughout the county.

There are about 3,400 markers in New York State... 81 in Onondaga County and 34 in Cortland County. The program was started in 1926 by the New York State Education Department to commemorate the sesquicentennial of the American Revolution and was discontinued in 1966. New York State no longer manages the historic marker program. Instead, local authorities, individuals and other organizations are responsible for the approval, installation., and maintenance of historic markers. Gail also discussed how the plaques themselves have changed over the years in the materials used, the colors, and the engraving.

Although no longer funded by the State, markers are still being installed throughout New York State. They are loved by the public and deemed a success. They have become a major way to inform the public and tourists of local history. We thank Gail for sharing her considerable knowledge with us and making us all aware of another way to learn about our proud heritage.

The next meeting will take place on Tuesday, Dec. 13th. Plans are still underway, and we are looking forward to having our own Vicki Burtson come and share Christmas carols with us. Mark your calendars.

The Board of Trustees met on Tuesday evening, November 15th for the monthly board meeting and continued to make progress on a variety of church issues. The Trustees have been working with the Board of Deacons on personnel issues and finance. The following issues were covered:



- The Personnel Committee and boards are working on extending the DCE contract, hiring a Teacher's Aid for the Homer Nursery School, and have finalized the Financial Secretary's Job Description.
- Actions are being taken to prepare the Manse for our new pastor.
- The railings for the front steps should be installed by the time this newsletter is distributed.
- We also continue to work on better ways to communicate among ourselves and with our community. The board has voted to make improvements to our webpage and an initial inventory of our electronic equipment has been completed.
- We have managed to follow the budget well so far in 2016. It is not clear how we will finish the year and everyone's continued support is appreciated. Draft 2017 budgets from both boards are now available for review and we encourage anyone who has not yet submitted their pledge to do so as soon as they are able; it really helps with planning for next year. Speak with any trustee, if you have questions about the budget; a final version will be approved at our Annual Meeting in January.

With the first snows of the season falling, I feel the peace and hope of Advent. It has been said that the symptoms of Advent include, an ability to appreciate and enjoy each moment, loss of interest in conflict and judging other people, susceptibility to the love extended by others and the uncontrollable urge to extend it, and contented feelings of connectedness with others and nature. I have faith that each of us shares these warm feelings and that is what makes our church family a great part of the body of Christ. As we anticipate the call of our new pastor, let us all look for ways we can support our church and carry it into the future.
