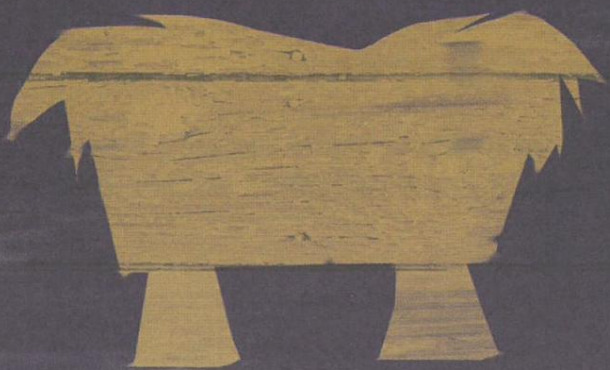

A HEBREW SCRIPTURE READING

Isaiah 9:2, 6-7

LIGHTING OF THE CHRIST CANDLE

One: Tonight we relight the four Advent candles to recall our journey to Christmas. We are a people of hope. Our hearts are full of anticipation for the coming of our beloved Christ Child. We light the Candle of Hope. (*candle lit*)

One: We are a people who seek peace. We know that God has told us to turn our weapons of war into instruments of care and healing. In the name of the Prince of Peace, we light the Candle of Peace. (*candle lit*)

One: Joy to the world! Our God brings us “good news.” We sing songs of praise and gladness. Let us light the Candle of Joy. (*candle lit*)

One: We are a people who seek to be brought together by the love of Christ. Acknowledging God’s gift of grace, we light the Candle of Love. (*candle lit*)

One: We also light the Christ Candle this night,. The color of the candle is white, symbolizing the light of day and the light that Christ shines into the world and through each of us. (*candle lit*)

Please join the Christian Education Ministry Committee on **January 1 after Worship** for the annual "**Striking of the Greens**," taking down the Christmas decorations.

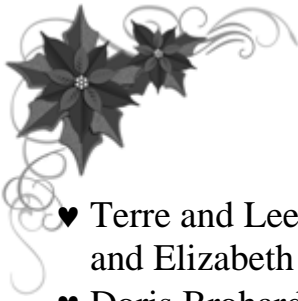
