

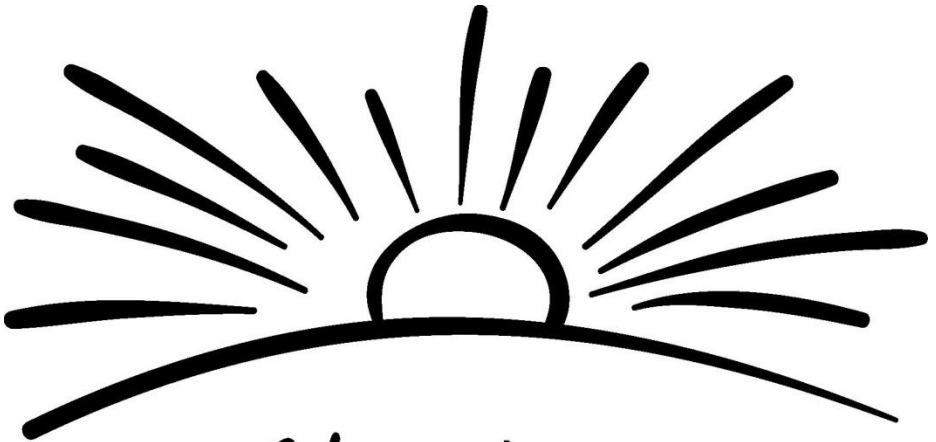

A SERVICE OF CANDLE LIGHTING FOR THE NEW YEAR

One: *(Lighting the first candle)* We light a candle remembering the children who were baptized this year and whom we have baptized. It beams that all children may be able to grow up receiving attention and affection.

All: We thank you, God!

One: *(Lighting the second candle)* We light a candle to remember all those, gay and straight, who celebrated weddings this year or who have celebrated wedding anniversaries, both those newly wed and those who have celebrated many years together.

All: We thank you, God!

One: (*Lighting the third candle*) We light a candle remembering all who have died this year. We light this same candle for all who mourn recent losses and losses of many years.

All: God, grant each of us your peace.

One: (*Lighting the fourth candle*) We light this candle commemorating all the people, near and far, who live under war and have suffered under violence and uncertainty. May you offer comfort and hope, O God.

All: We thank you, God!

One: (*Lighting the fifth candle*) We light this candle to remember all the marvelous things we have experienced this past year. For greater and smaller moments this light beams into the new year, that we may recall wonder and joy in the days ahead.

All: We thank you, God!

One: (*Lighting the sixth candle*) We light this candle for this congregation and for the church universal, that we may be light and leaven, growing in love with your presence and deepening our compassion for others.

All: We thank you, God!

One: (*Lighting the seventh candle*) We light this candle for the truth of struggle, struggle to find freedom from personal shortcomings, despair, things that allure us and then disappoint us. May this light stand as our full longing for justice with peace in our lives, community, and in all creation.

All: God, grant us all a just peace.

Other candles may now be lighted for personal, family, or community celebrations or hopes for the new year. Come forward and light a candle. You may share aloud your commemoration or hope.
