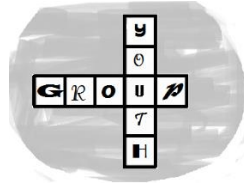
HOMER NURSERY SCHOOL MONTHLY UPDATE

FAQS ABOUT STEPHEN MINISTRY

What exactly is Stephen Ministry?

Stephen Ministry is a ministry of our congregation in which trained and supervised lay persons, called Stephen Ministers; provide one-to-one Christian care to individuals facing life challenges or difficulties.

Who is involved?

- **Stephen Leaders** are the people who oversee and direct our Stephen Ministry. They recruit, select, train, organize, and supervise our Stephen Ministers, identify people in need of care, and match them with a Stephen Minister. We have two Stephen Leaders: Belinda Burtner & Bill Masterson.
- **Stephen Ministers** are the caregivers. They will engage in 50 hours of training in Christian caregiving, including general topics such as listening, feelings, boundaries, assertiveness, and using Christian resources in caregiving. In addition, their training will cover specialized topics such as ministering to the divorced, hospitalized, bereaved, and aging.
- **Care receivers** are the recipients of Stephen Ministers' care. They are people from our church or community who are experiencing divorce, grief, loss of a job, loneliness, hospitalization, terminal illness, or any of a number of other life difficulties. Stephen Ministers usually meet with their care receivers once a week for about an hour for as long as the care receiver will benefit by the relationship.



What do Stephen Ministers do?

Stephen Ministers are caring Christian friends who listen, understand, accept, and pray for and with care receivers who are working through a crisis or a tough time.

Are Stephen Ministers Counselors?

Stephen Ministers are not counselors; they are trained lay caregivers. Their role is to listen and care-not to give advice or counsel. Stephen Ministers are also trained to recognize when a care receiver's need exceeds what they can provide. When that happens, they work with care receivers to help them receive the level of care they really need.

What does the Stephen Ministry logo represent?

The Stephen Ministry logo consists of a cross and circle together with a broken person and a whole person. The broken person behind the cross symbolizes the brokenness in our lives due to our sin and imperfections. The whole person stands in front of the cross because it is only through the cross of Jesus that we are made whole. The circle symbolizes both the wholeness we receive through Christ and God's unending love for us.

THE TRUSTEES CORNER

Members of the Board of Trustees met on Tuesday evening, May 16, for the monthly board meeting and continued to make progress on a variety of church issues. The board discussed progress on the church technology upgrade, Manse rejuvenation, and fundraising. The following are some of the issues covered:

- The upgrade of the computer technology continues. Wiring of the building and installation of wireless hotspots has been completed and we have secure internal and guest networks that cover the entire building. We have acquired a scanner to help with our account system and will get a secure file server soon. We may now embrace new technology to carry out our mission in new and better ways. Some of these upgrades are covered by our Capital Project Funds, but other components are not. If this project is of interest to you, we would welcome any donations to help make your technological vision a reality; talk with Jim McKenna, Pastor Vicki, or any of the Trustees or Communication Committee members.
- Most work on the Manse has been completed. Repairs to the porch are done, but work on the front railings needs to be done, as well as extensive landscape work. Watch for an opportunity to join a work crew to help with the landscaping. Basic church repair and maintenance also continues.
- We are watching the budget closely this year and will explore new fundraisers. The finances were a close balance this month. All ideas and volunteer efforts are welcome. Assistance with organizing the Route 90 sale, Holiday in Homer, and Magic on Main Street would be appreciated.
- Remember that our church webpage now has a donation button for anyone who wishes to give electronically, and electronic newsletters have been distributed and available on our webpage. If you elected to pick your hard copy up at church, please find your addressed copy in the Russell Fellowship Room.

I hope you are all enjoying the life of spring and looking forward to the enlightenment of Pentecost. The work of the boards allows the church to think and grow in new ways as the church vision unfolds, and you can help. Please consider being part of one of our committees and using your time and talents to help our church grow and prosper. There have been moments of quiet, observing birds, flowers, a lemon tree and breath-taking seascapes. There have also been raucous moments of storytelling and joke telling and cheering on the San Francisco Giants. Tomorrow we hope to have lunch with James McKenna before taking a "red eye" back to Syracuse—just in time to go to the New York Conference (UCC) in Tarrytown, NY.

I know that we are very blessed to have the chance to get away for a whole week. Not everyone gets vacation, so we are aware of this marvelous gift of time.
