STEPHEN MINISTRY – MORE FAQS

Where did Stephen Ministry start?

Stephen Ministry has been around since 1975, when Kenneth Haugk, a pastor and clinical psychologist, began it to multiply the caregiving in his congregation in St. Louis, Missouri. We are just beginning our Stephen Ministry here at the Homer Congregational Church, and are one of more than 10,000 Stephen Ministry congregations from more than 150 denominations. Stephen Ministries St. Louis, the organization behind this international ministry, is headquartered in Missouri.



Why the name Stephen?

The name Stephen comes from St. Stephen, who was the first lay person commissioned by the apostles to provide caring ministry to those in need as recorded in Acts 6.

Can I trust a Stephen Minister?

Trust is essential to a caring relationship, and Stephen Ministers are people you can trust. Confidentiality is one of the most important principles of Stephen Ministry. What a care receiver tells his or her Stephen Minister is kept in strictest confidence.

What is the Pastor's role?

Pastors will always be the primary caregivers, but there is no way pastors can meet all the needs for care. God has called all of us, not just pastors, to minister to one another. Stephen Ministry multiplies ministry by turning pastors into equippers so they can enable lay people to provide caring ministry as well.

How can someone receive care from a Stephen Minister?

Our Stephen Leaders are Belinda Burtner and Bill Masterson. You may talk to a Stephen Leader or Pastor Vicki; they will be happy to help you through the process of receiving care.

How much does it cost?

Stephen Ministry is a caregiving ministry available to our members and community free of charge.

How can someone become a Stephen Minister?

Begin by talking with one of our Stephen Leaders and they can tell you more. Stephen Ministers make a two-year commitment to train and serve.

Members of the Board of Trustees met on Tuesday evening, June 20th for the monthly board meeting and continued to make progress on a variety of church issues. The board discussed progress on the church technology upgrade, Manse landscaping, and Holiday in Homer. The following are some of the issues covered:

- Most work on the Manse has been completed, but the landscape is in desperate need of attention. The board voted to hire Joe Settineri to do that landscaping for us. At the same time, the Memorial Committee hired Joe to tidy up the Memorial Garden. Thanks Joe, Logan Schmidt, and Evan Ulrich, who are helping! Basic church repair and maintenance also continues.
- The upgrade of the computer technology continues. We have secure internal and guest wireless network access that covers the entire building. We have acquired a scanner to help with our account system. The board and Pastor Vicki discussed ways to use this technology to carry out our mission in new and better ways. Some of these upgrades are covered by our Capital Project Funds, but other components are not. Our Communication Committee has been a tremendous help with this effort and continues to provide great advice. If making our technological vision a reality is of interest to you, we would welcome your help. Talk with Jim McKenna, Pastor Vicki, or any of the Trustees.
- We are watching the budget closely this year and will explore new fundraisers. The finances were a close balance this month. All ideas and volunteer efforts are welcome. Assistance with organizing the Route 90 sale, Holiday in Homer, and Magic on Main Street would be appreciated.
- Remember to check out our church webpage and Facebook page (a donation button is available), and electronic newsletters have been distributed and available on our webpage. If you elected to pick your hard copy up at church, please find your addressed copy in the Russell Fellowship room.

Today is the first full day of summer and I am enjoying the baby birds that are out and learning to fly. I hope you are spreading your wings, as well. The work of the boards allows the church to think and grow in new ways as the church vision unfolds. You can help.
