- **Notes of Connection and Hope**

During these times of social isolation, The Outreach Team welcomes you to write note cards of hope and connection to be distributed to **Meals on Wheels** recipients. Our goal is to collect **225 note cards by March 21**. Use your own note cards and drop off at church (leave the envelope blank). Or come early to worship on Sunday and fill out a few cards in the fellowship room. Children and youth are invited to draw a picture and write a message. Out of respect for the variety of faith traditions of the recipients, we encourage you to refrain from religious messages.
