THANKSGIVING EDITION

Tomorrow will be a day of giving thanks. Some of us will gather with the whole family to enjoy all the traditions of the day. Some of us will bow our heads at a table set for one. Others will eat on the fly so they can serve thanksgiving dinner to people without a home. No matter how your day is spent, I hope you will take a moment for reflection.

According to the Bible thanks-giving has been expressed since the earliest of times. When the ancient Hebrews escaped from Pharaoh across the dry land of the Red Sea, Miriam danced her song of thanksgiving. When the exiles in Babylon returned home to Jerusalem, they could hardly contain their joy-filled thanks. The Psalms are replete with phrases like “O give thanks to our God!”

Reflecting on her ancestors who were first on this continent, Terra Trevor (mixed Cherokee, Seneca, German ancestry) wrote:

All of the Elders I know tell me Native People have been giving thanks for as long as people have existed. After the corn was all dried, pumpkins sliced, and the wild plums brought in it was a time for “giving thanks.” When the food was together for the hard winter months and when the work was all done, they gathered.

When our immigrant ancestors arrived on this continent, they met the native peoples for whom thanks-giving was just a way of life. We celebrate a day, yet we recognize the act of giving thanks has happened since the beginning of time.

Tomorrow we will, once again, pause to give thanks. When we do, let us remember God’s direction, sent through Jesus.

Love God. Give thanks to God.

Love neighbor –

the ones who came first and the ones who immigrated to this land;
the ones who eat what we eat
and the ones whose cultural traditions bring “different” food to the table;
the ones who we like and agree with
and the ones whose perspective is hard to understand,
but who are no less children of God.

When I gather at our table of thanksgiving, I will remember and give thanks for this family of faith. You work hard. Your love and commitment is felt beyond our walls. I continue to thank God for my call to serve you right here, right now.

MISSION TRIP OPPORTUNITY

Our support for the UCC sponsored mission in Honduras has been steady over time. Now, we can help in person. The NY Conference is organizing a **mission trip February 26 – March 6, 2022** to travel to the village and help with the school construction, sewing project and marketing. They have room for up to five adults or mature youth. A passport is required as well as appropriate medical inoculations. Spanish is *not* needed (there are interpreters). Our mission committee will subsidize the cost by paying for the airfare and room and board while on the mission. (There may be an additional cost to visit and view the Mayan City ~\$250.)
