## ADVENT WAITING...

This week, Jack and Amelia Brown will light the PEACE candle on the Advent Wreath. I wonder how we are doing with that concept...peace? I'll be honest. There have been moments this week when peace felt like a fantasy. Another shooting happened. People are coming down with pneumonia. There are families who are struggling with cancer and debt and worry and traumas too personal to share with our whole family of faith.

Thus, I was grateful to read in our book All I Really Want about the two kinds of waiting described on pp. 12-13. There is the first kind of waiting that looks at the state of the world and wonders when is God going to show up? I thought to myself...yes...when, God??

And then it felt as though God was whispering – *don't forget that other kind of waiting!* That is the God-is-almost-here (again) waiting. Someone quietly inquires if a person has enough money for lunch...(yes, I do, thank you.)...and the story is told with but-what-if-I-didn't-ask tears. There is the waiting for Sunday morning, knowing that our sanctuary will be transformed (again) with some boughs and Christmas lights to a vision of peace.

In the midst of the WHEN, God? waiting, we do not lose hope. Again and again, God reappears, if only we take the time to wait and watch and listen.
