Maundy Thursday

One of Leonardo da Vinci's most famous paintings is that of the Last Supper. Painted between 1494-1498, his tableau offers a fifteen-century view of Jesus' last gathering at table with the disciples. On Maundy Thursday, the tableau becomes a living portrayal of the disciples, grappling with the bewildering news that one of them would betray Jesus. This past Sunday, 13 men drew their disciple's name:

Each disciple will share the background of his relationship with Jesus as he grapples with the disturbing news of betrayal. **The Last Supper** will begin at 7 PM.
