A bit about The Lion King:

The Lion King is a 1994 Disney animated musical that focuses on the story of Simba, a young lion cub who cannot wait to become King of Pride Rock! But first, he must learn a few difficult lessons; especially since Mufasa's younger brother, Scar, covets the throne and plots to eliminate Mufasa and Simba, so he can become king instead.

Ultimately, Scar sets a trap for his brother and nephew, luring Simba into a gorge where Scar's minions, the hyenas, drive a large herd of wildebeest into a stampede that will trample him. In a rescue attempt, Mufasa saves Simba, but ends up hanging perilously from the gorge's edge. Scar refuses to help Mufasa, instead sending him falling to his death. He then convinces Simba that the tragedy was Simba's own fault and advises him to leave the kingdom and never return. Scar then becomes king, but drives the kingdom into ruin.

Meanwhile, during his time in exile, Simba learns a new motto—"Hakuna Matata"—which means "no worries." It's this "no worries" lifestyle that Simba dedicates himself to, along with his new friends, Timon and Pumbaa. As Pride Rock continues to decline, Simba is visited by Nala, but she is unable to convince him to return to take his place as the true king. Enter the wise baboon, Rafiki, who offers Simba some sage advice while reminding him who he is.

Duly inspired, Simba returns to Pride Rock to claim his place as rightful heir to King Mufasa, and returns the kingdom to its former glory; thus completing the "Circle of Life."
