COMMITTEE REPORTS

The **Stewardship Committee** met on Monday to offer their leadership in stewardship for 2022. Speakers will offer a *Stewardship Moment* each Sunday from now until November 14. Communications with the whole congregation are underway.

The **Trustees** met on Wednesday:

- The issue with the security alarm has been resolved. A hole in the conduit for the wires has been repaired and damaged wires have been replaced.
- Funding has been donated for the purchase of two TVs for the sanctuary. This will improve the quality of our visual technology and replace the use of projector/screen. Care is being taken to ensure the installation matches the woodworking in our sanctuary.
- Our ramp entrance needs repair. Work should begin early in November.
- Due to issues of Covid, we will continue wearing masks in our building.

Imagine for a moment what the world might look like if we as people of faith, morality, and conscience actually aspired to this mantra...What if we invited one another to share in wide-open, fearless, spiritual communities truly marked by compassion and interdependence? What if we daily challenged ourselves to live a faith that simply made us better humans? John Pavlovitz explores how we can embody this *kinder* kind of spirituality where we humbly examine our belief system to understand how it might compel us to act in less-than-loving ways toward others.
