OUR LENTEN JOURNEY

From December through June, Christian churches remember Jesus' life. The Word made Flesh, dwells with us from birth into childhood. His cousin John-the-Baptizer helps kick off an adult public ministry. A storyteller at heart, Jesus uses common images (different soils for planting, a *good* enemy, a mustard seed) to tease his posse into understanding a new Way of life. We follow. We learn. We, too, are changed.

Years ago, Nancy Stockholm's daughter Karyn was preparing for a long trip. When questioned if she was dreading the driving she laughed and reminded me that if one had "good tunes", the trip was manageable.

Still following Jesus, we now turn our heads toward Jerusalem. The journey through Lent is about being more mindful. It is a time of slowing down and it offers the chance to consider *Am I really being the person I intend to be*? The "tune" that will accompany us on this trip is:

Jesus walked this lonesome valley; he had to walk it by himself.
Oh, nobody else could walk it for him. He had to walk it by himself.
And this year, our wilderness journey will include a stone – selected next Wednesday and carried through the season. It will be a reminder, a symbol, perhaps a scapegoat. Ready? Here is how we begin...

Ash Wednesday Service

Set in the sanctuary, we begin our journey through Lent. The palms from Palm Sunday 2021 are the ashes for this service. We hope you will gather for this quiet service of prayer and contemplation.
