**Sunday:** "Music Brings the Neighborhood Together" - Bill Carter Bill Carter blends his work as a jazz composer with his calling as a Presbyterian pastor. An author and composer/performer with 11 CDs, he travels widely as a speaker, teacher, workshop leader, and jazz pianist.

**Monday:** "New Neighbors: Immigration" - Sophie Clough Sophie Clough is the Collections & Research Assistant at the Cortland County Historical Society. In "New Neighbors" Sophie discusses the unique identities and profound influence of Irish, Italian, Ukrainian, and Lebanese immigrants to Cortland.

**Tuesday:** "Neighbors Help Neighbors: Underground Railroad" - Tabitha Scoville Tabitha Scoville is the Director of the Cortland County Historical Society. Tabitha will share an overview of the Underground Railroad and what we know about local people's involvement in this great struggle for human rights.

**Wednesday**: "Birds in the Neighborhood" - Jim McKenna Jim McKenna is a Research Ecologist and has been a birder since he was 13. He has studied birds from our neighborhood to the tropics and the Antarctic. Jim's talk will include some bird identification, a brief photo tour of birds in our own and distant neighborhoods, and will focus on the inspiration that birds can provide.

**Thursday:** "Celebrating with Neighbors" Enjoy ice cream in the UPC parking lot, then wander next-door to Courthouse Park for the Cortland Arts Council Concert featuring Austin MacRae. Music critic John Tierney says, "An Austin MacRae song is a short story in four minutes...(and) some fine picking."
