INFORMATION FROM THE DEACONS AND THE TRUSTEES

During recent meetings, the following projects were discussed:

- We remember how good it is to savor a cup of coffee as we chat following worship. That's why we look forward to the return of Coffee Hour this fall. Various committees will host once each month. The other Sundays will be available for you to invite a friend to co-host with you. All we really need is some coffee and juice. Let's keep it simple as we get to know one another (again)! When you are invited to host, we hope you will say yes.
- In response to the devastating wildfire in Maui, our Mission Committee encourages a special offering. Sent through the UCC, the offering will be matched by funds from the Dorothy Jane Andrews Fund.
- The Deacons voted to invest most of their portion of the Harris Estate in a sixmonth CD. They will use the 6-month period to set some goals for use of this gift.
- The Trustees have approved the use of space in our building by the Cloud Nine Enrichment program. This fall, on Tuesdays from 9 noon the nursery rooms will be used for the youngest group of children who are being home-schooled. Cloud Nine used space at the Center for the Arts last year; however, they needed a bit more room. We look forward to this cooperative adventure that begins in September.
- After some research and resulting discussions, earlier this summer the Trustees voted to move our bank accounts to Tompkins Trust. The process is now completed.
- Work will begin this fall on some renovations to the restrooms off the RFR. The committee guiding the project is Paula Harrington, Lee & Terre Dennis and Kathleen Dentes.
