#### SIGHTS AND SOUNDS OF THE SEASON SO FAR...

- Dec. 1 (the Painted Turtle day) It started with a count-down. 3...2...1...and our green became a community display of lights from the Christmas tree to trumpeting angels to the nativity. The display includes the names of people who have died, but more than names, these are cherished ones who live on in our hearts.
- Dec. 2 (the day of the Muskrat) After a sumptuous dish-to-pass dinner, the sanctuary was transformed to marvelous seasonal beauty. Trees went up, lights were lit, boughs were fluffed and dropped onto the sides of the balcony. It is breathtaking and holy.

After lighting the middle candle (called the Shamash) we light the appropriate number of candles per night. Acknowledging a world in deep need, we end by singing "...*let there be peace on earth and let it begin with me*." May it be so.
- Dec. 10 (Wood Frog day) Those who worship with us online looked upon a congregation of sheep and shepherds and wise people and angels even as Mary, Joseph and Jesus ((Amanda McCaslin, Kelly Thomsen & their daughter, Indiana) traveled to Bethlehem. Say it with us: Good News! (GOOD NEWS!) Great Joy! (GREAT JOY!) And can't you just see the angel Gabriel (who looked a lot like David Ford) flinging festive confetti into the air? 11-month-old Reagan Anise McCall captured the day as she helped her mom and her Gibby to light the candle of JOY for Advent.
- Dec. 12 (Little Brown Bat day) At least 24 people were free on a Tuesday afternoon for tea with Pastor Vicki. The tables were adorned with simple greens and our special teacups or mugs.
