Deacons:

- Elected Lori Schmidt (chair), Joanne Cincotta (vice chair), Julie Freeman (secretary), and Carol Costell Corbin (treasurer).
- Endorsed a three-part proposal for the Harris Estate funds:
 - to support youth ministry,
 - to fund new or existing mission and outreach projects, and
 - to develop a special speaker series that will spiritually feed our congregation and the wider community.
- Concluded the retreat by presenting Sam Penoyer with a Deacon's cross.

Trustees:

- Welcomed new Trustees: Stef Fellows, Lloyd Gmoser, Rev. Barb Wright.
- Elected Paula Harrington (chair) and Shelly Hilts (secretary). Barb Wright agreed to coordinate use of building/green requests.
- Heard updates about asbestos removal (finished on the day we met). The next projects include painting the basement (beginning this weekend) and then installing new flooring.
- Received updates about a lease agreement with the Center for the Arts to acquire the Little White Church. Lawyer John Sidd is providing helpful guidance.
- Narthex bathrooms will be spruced up in May or June. RFR bathrooms are next.
- Agreed that our sign (which has been malfunctioning this winter) needs to either be repaired or replaced. Our vision is to cooperate with other organizations so that the sign can represent the entire community.
